Civil-military interdepencies

Civilian cross subsidies for military nuclear programs build the fundamental link:

Nuclear expert Mycle Schneider: "The civil military overlap is primarily about mutual dependence of the military-civil nuclear complex. The military uses the same pool of engineers, specialists as the civil nuclear industry. The competencies at stake, security and concept studies, material and ageing problems are the same."

The World Nuclear Industry Status Report WNISR 2018

 Nuclear power is rooted in human rights violations and environmental racism: Indigenous people, people of color and low-income communities are targeted for uranium mining and radioactive waste. Radiation harms women and girls at twice the rate as their male counterparts. And radioactive pollution indiscriminately harms future generations, poisoning the environment for hundreds to thousands of years.

 Too Dirty: Nuclear reactors and the nuclear fuel chain produce vast amounts of lethal radioactive waste, which grow whenever nuclear power is used. The nuclear fuel chain is responsible for far more carbon emissions than renewable energy generation and improved energy efficiency. All reactors routinely emit radiation and radioactive waste. Scientific bodies agree and have confirmed that there is no "safe" level of radiation exposure.

 Too Dangerous: Continued use of nuclear power will sooner or later lead to more Fukushimas, Church Rocks, and Chernobyls. The technology and materials needed to generate nuclear energy can be diverted to nuclear weapons programs.

 Too Expensive: Nuclear power is the costliest means possible of reducing carbon and methane emissions; its use crowds out investment in clean energy sources.

 Too Slow: Use of nuclear power to reduce fossil fuel emissions would require an unprecedented nuclear construction program, beyond the capability of the world's manufacturers within an acceptable time frame.

"A strong domestic supply chain is needed to provide for nuclear Navy requirements. This supply chain has an inherent and very strong overlap with the commercial nuclear energy".

Lingen and Gronau

Lingen nuclear fuel production facility belongs to ANF (subsidiary of Framatom), supplies belgian Doel 1-3, the french scrap factories Fessenheim 1-2, Cattenom 1-2 und Bugey 4, also Forsmark in Sweden, Gösgen and Leibstadt in Switzerland, Olkiluoto 1 in Finland and almost all of the remaining NPP in Germany.

Gronau Uranium enrichment, Urenco (german, netherland, britisch company, 1/3 belongs to british State, 1/3 netherlands State and 1/3 to german energy companies RWE and E.ON) supplies every 10th NPP worldwide, for example Tepco (Japan) until 2011.

Both have unlimited operating licenses.

The military usability of uranium enrichment and its centrifuge technology are "the easiest way to the nuclear bomb". Michael Sailer, head of waste management commission of german federal government (ESK).
